Why Small Charities?

In the corporate world, great ideas are rewarded. Funds quickly flow to the most effective companies.

In the charity sector that isn't always the case. The big names with big budgets receive the lion's share of income, irrespective of their efficacy.

In fact, small charities are specialists; the best are innovative, agile and well placed in communities to help where the need is greatest.

Top 5% of charities in terms of turnover receive 88% of donations in UK.



Despite a tough economic environment where many charities have struggled or closed, RYH charities saw growth across three key metrics in 2023. On average:

- Income of RYH charities **increased by 17%**
- Number of children worked with **increased by 25%**





The Leverage Model

As a charity ourselves, we're able to offer donors two options:

To fund RYH itself. Every £1 given unlocks £3 for our platform charities.

To pass funds straight to RYH charities with no charge (default option)

RYH charities are selected to create a balanced portfolio across a wide range of causes.

Mental health (14)*
Educational attainment (10)*
Youth employment (5)*
Levelling out inequality (12)*


Other examples of how they work:


- Sport, nature and the arts as therapy for trauma, abuse, bereavement


Become

There are 100,000 young people in care in the UK. Many enter the system having faced trauma, only to be moved between homes and let down by the system that is meant to help them.

The result: care-experienced people are overrepresented amongst people experiencing homelessness and within the criminal justice system.

What is exceptional about Become?

- Their Care Advice Line offers advice on finance, accessing higher education, housing and homelessness
- Weekly Link-Ups offer a safe space where young people can come together, develop community, and have fun
- 1 to 1 coaching to help young people through college and university, breaking long term cycles of inequality





How we find the hidden gems

Many funders accept hundreds of applications from charities for each grant offered. It's a wasteful process that eats up already limited fundraising resources.

In this respect, RYH aims to set new standards.

The first step in our selection process sees us do the heavy lifting. We actively seek out and research charities that stand out. Then we invite them to submit an application.

It's doubly satisfying when we come across a hidden gem.





Due Diligence

RYH due diligence and monitoring of our charities has been developed and refined over several years.

The result is not only a robust process but one that aims to reduce the burden on our charities, freeing up their resources.

Monitoring & Impact Reporting

Each year we assess the charities' progress against objectives and flag any potential areas of concern.

Our annual Impact Report pulls together key data points at an individual charity level, and from across the platform.

Empowering Young People

Abdul



When I was growing up I could see a crack house from my bedroom window. People were attacked outside. Other gangs would try and raid it.

When it first starts you think 'this ain't right'. But it becomes normal.

I first came to Empire when I was 11. I got referred by school because I was getting into so much trouble.

I was told I'd be sent to a pupil referral unit. That's not a place you want to be, metal bars in the windows, the doors are locked, tables bolted to the floor, the wrong people.


It was then that I realised, ok, that's not me. I need to start being more mature, more mindful of how I'm acting.

I went on a twenty week programme at Empire with Courtney. He'd teach me how to box. We'd talk through things. If I was misbehaving, he'd get on my case. I'm proud of how far I've come, how I've matured. Compared to 3 or 4 years ago, you wouldn't think it's the same person.

Secret talents? My mum brought me a diablo, the thing on a string. I was oddly good at it. I know a couple of tricks.

I'm in my first year of college, studying sports coaching and development. I grew up being coached by people like Courtney. If they can do it for me, I don't see why I can't do it for other people.



Investing in long term growth

It's a success for us when one of our charities passes the £2m income threshold we use to define a small charity.

We've seen four charities outgrow us in the past five years.

The average growth of our charities during their time on our platform:

- ► 22% for year-on-year income
- 20% for the number of children and young people supported, year-on-year

Empowering Young People

Olivia

Sometimes when I go outside, all I see is grey, brown. I'd like to see somewhere green where people aren't depressed or deprived.

Growing up, conservation wasn't really on my mind. I didn't know about the darker sides of environmental issues.

We were really bored in summer. A teacher told us about Action for Conservation.

At camp, we all bonded together. It was just us being out in nature, talking, laughing. I found out about healthy foods I never would have tried.

I held a baby robin. The trick with holding a bird is being gentle. You could feel their heartbeat, I wasn't expecting that.

Through Action for Conservation, I did an interview with Chantelle Lindsay, a presenter of CBeebies who I look up to. She's a person of colour, and has been told 'no' a lot. But she was able to do something she loved.



I was really proud of the speech I did at Chester Zoo. I used to go there when I was a child on school trips. I never would have thought that people would listen and take something from what I was saying.

Hannah (AFC youth worker) is always there for me. She's made a real difference in my life.

To the government I'd say, stop trying to make excuses about something that you can fix. By 2030, by 2050 things are going to look bad. You're wasting time. Take action now.

An increasing number of our charities are working to ensure marginalised young people aren't left behind under mounting financial pressures.

Without the skills and understanding of financial management and budgeting, they are at risk of long-term financial instability.

Empire Fighting Chance

In 2021, EFC launched their 'Streetwise with Money' course, giving young people 14+ the knowledge and confidence to manage their money safely, including:

- Understanding payslips and taxes
- How to budget money sensibly
- Exploring the different types of bank account
- Learning about payments and investments

When young people have their first taste of earning money, they generally aren't educated on how to use it wisely. We learn a lot in school, but important life lessons like what taxes mean and what different bank accounts can do for you are missing.

We're very proud of the Streetwise with Money course. It makes a real difference to how young people in the UK are spending and saving their money.


